Why Do They Call It “Dorcas House?”

**The Very Rev. Scott Richardson,
Dean of St. Paul’s Cathedral
to preach June 14**



Come welcome The Rev. Scott Richardson, third dean of St. Paul’s Cathedral in San Diego, Sunday, June 14, and learn how children who began their lives in prison, are thriving in school, and some are heading to college. And find out why they call it “Dorcas House.” Founded in 1992, Dorcas House provides a safe haven, schooling, medical care and love to 40 children whose parents are incarcerated.



Until 2003, more than 400 children lived in the Tijuana state penitentiary. Their crime? They were the children of convicts with nowhere else to live.

St. Paul’s Cathedral took over operations in 2006, with St. James being a major partner through Church & The World Ministries and the

St. James Gift Shop 2008 fundraiser. Many other parishes around the diocese are also involved.

Scott Richardson grew up in a Lutheran household in the bay area of California. He received his B.A. in Religious Studies in 1975, graduating with High Honors from UCSB.

After college, Richardson spent ten years in youth work, first as a residence counselor at the Ojai Valley School, then as the Program Director of the Santa Paula Boys and Girls Club. Later he became the Director of Youth Ministry at *Saint Paul’s Episcopal Church* in Ventura.

Richardson became a confirmed Episcopalian at Saint Paul’s and began the discernment process that led to priesthood.

In 1986, Richardson began his theological studies at General Seminary in New York City. He served as a chaplain at Saint Luke’s Hospital and as an intern at Bailey House, a hospice for homeless people living with HIV/AIDS.

After graduating in 1989, Richardson was called as curate to *Saint Wilfrid’s* in Huntington Beach. Three years later he became the rector at *Saint Mary’s* in Lompoc. After six years, he moved to *All Saints Church* in Pasadena, eventually becoming the Associate Rector.



In the spring of 2003 he became the third dean of *Saint Paul’s Cathedral*, San Diego.

He is passionate about spiritual practices (worship, prayer, learning, service and generosity), multi-cultural process, and creating an environment at the cathedral wherein everyone is welcome and where all are agents of deep reconciliation.

Richardson is married to The Rev. Mary Moreno Richardson, a deacon in the Episcopal Church who currently serves as the diocesan coordinator of Hispanic Ministry in the downtown San Diego area.

The Rev. Scott Richardson will preach at both services and lead the Sunday Adult Forum at 9 am to 9:45 in the Van Schaick Room. Welcome him to St. James!

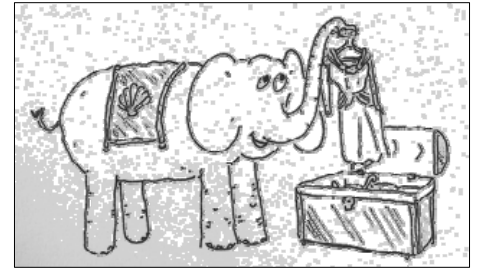
